The upper Loire valley is best known for Sauvignon blanc, ranging from the lighter softer styles, the flintier and drier Pouilly Fumés, and the fuller and fruitier Sancerres. However, the richer Chenin wines from the best producers in Anjou and Vouvray are a joy to drink and complement many richer or spicy dishes. The Saumur Château Fosse Seche, sweet harvest vinified in a dry white style, offers a complexity of rich fruit flavour with a mineral freshness.

The combination of low alcohol levels and finely tuned fruit in the Kabinetts make them ideal aperitif or lunch time wines. The Spätlese are more powerful and racy both in term of fruit and body and ideal with dishes such as Foie Gras, or Lobster. The Grosses Gewachs, represent the Grand Cru Vineyard of Germany.

Tuscany

The dramatic increase in the quality of vineyard management and winemaking technique in Tuscany has led to huge worldwide demand for these wines. Very much inspired by the 'SuperTuscans', those 'vino da tavola' that fall outside the archaic Italian legislation which does not allow 'foreign' grape varieties or innovative wine making techniques, even the quality of Chiantis and Brunellos have shown a huge leap in quality.

The Sangiovese grape is King in Tuscany, although it is also known under other guises, such as Brunello in Montalcino in the warmer southern part of Tuscany. Cabernet Sauvignon has also been very successful, blended with Sangiovese, or with Merlot, which has remarkable results on the west coast of Tuscany (notably Lupicaia, a sensational wine which is the same quality as the best Pauillacs). Syrah has also proved remarkably successful at Le Macchiole on the coast in Bolgheri.
