Opened in 2005, and fabulously located within the heart of the prestigious financial district, Mandarin Oriental, Tokyo brings contemporary luxury to Nihonbashi, the historical and cultural centre of Tokyo commerce.

Overlooking the Imperial Palace Garden to the west and Tokyo Bay to the east, the hotel's award-winning spacious guestrooms, trendsetting Michelin-starred restaurants and exclusive spa are situated within the top floors of the soaring Nihonbashi Mitsui Tower, while its business centre and stately banquet and

conference facilities reside within the adjacent Mitsui Main Building, a cultural heritage property.

The dynamic multi-purpose complex blends the best of new and old architecture and has direct access to the city's subway stations, and is just minutes walking distance from Mitsukoshi's main department store, the Tokyo Stock Exchange, Bank of Japan, Tokyo Station, Imperial Palace and exclusive Ginza shopping area.

LOCATION

A few minutes walk from Mandarin Oriental, Tokyo is the celebrated "Bridge of Japan" from which Nihonbashi takes its name. Next to the bridge is the traditional zero-mile marker from where the cities infrastructure was initiated. Japan's major financial, insurance and securities firms grew around this landmark along with many centuries-old Japanese shops. Guests arriving at Mandarin Oriental, Tokyo will be ushered through a private entrance and via spacious high-tech elevators, directly to the 38th floor Sky Lobby, where a breathtaking view of the dramatic cityscape and sky above is revealed through oversized glass windows.

GUESTROOMS AND SUITES



The 179 luxurious appointed guestrooms and suites located from the 30th to 36th floors of the futuristic, 38-storey Nihonbashi Mitsui Tower provide spectacular views of the Tokyo metropolis through large guest room bay windows. The oversized guestrooms range from 50 to 60 square metres, while the opulent suites range from 90 to 250 square metres.

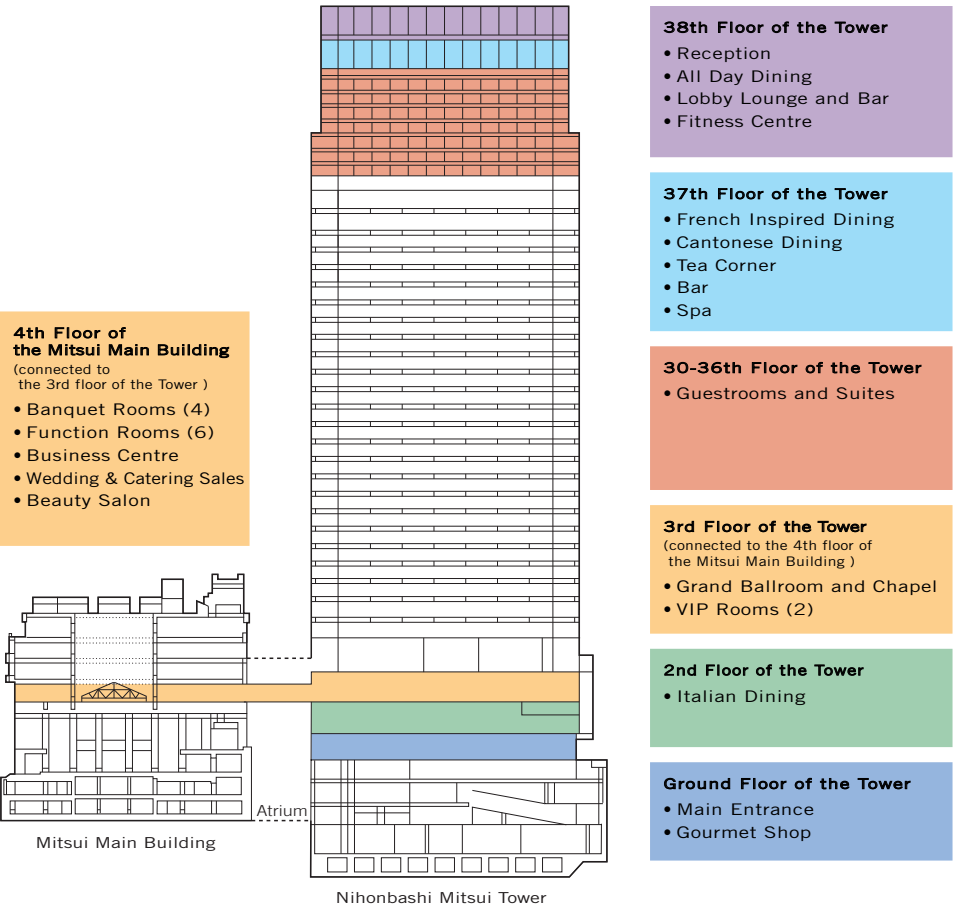

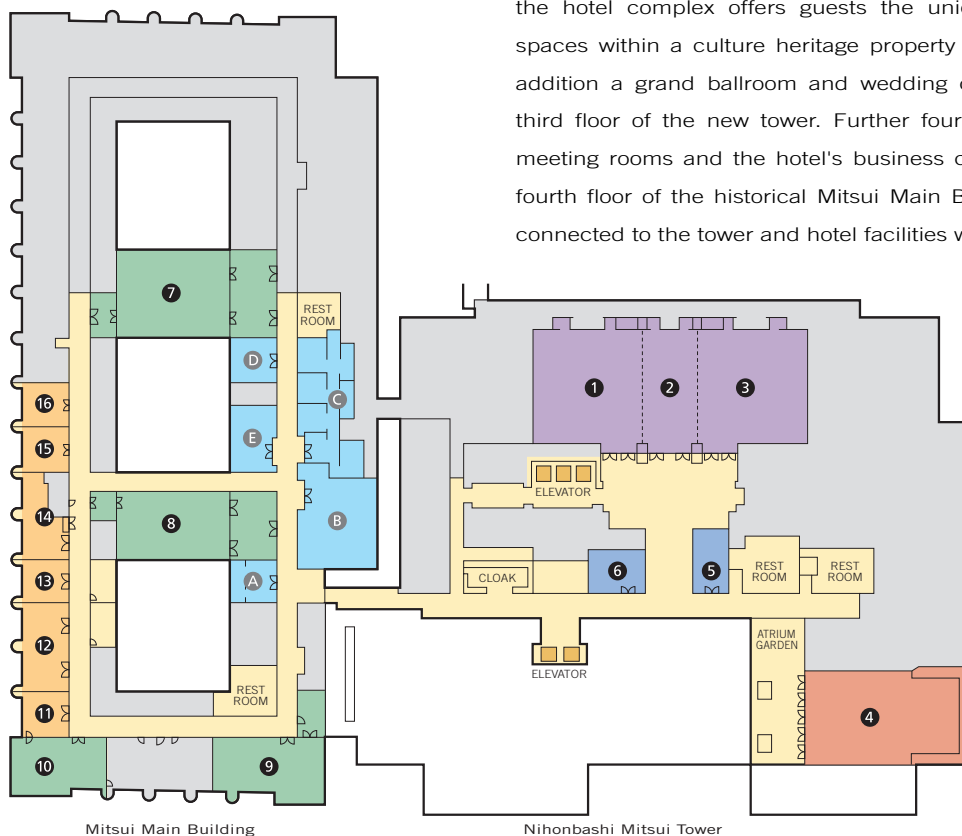
- Narita International Airport approx. 70 minutes by car
